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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 5 April 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 5 April 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 5 April 2021

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

2020 was a very different year for Haddo Arts. The Trustees realised early on into the year that due to the coronavirus pandemic, it was going to be very unlikely that the Festival could be staged in the usual way, with audiences in the various venues at Haddo. However, recognising that 2020 was proving difficult and challenging for everyone and particularly for performers and artists deprived of the ability to engage with audiences in live performance as concerts and festivals were cancelled, the Trustees wanted to help and support the musicians and performers by delivering as many elements of the Festival as possible, albeit it in a different way.

Some events were postponed to the 10th anniversary Festival in 2021 and the remainder were pre-recorded and streamed as YouTube Premieres during Festival week from 3-8 October. It was particularly gratifying to be able to record a number of the events and trailers at Haddo, thereby retaining the place specific nature of the Festival and introducing a wider audience to its beautiful venues. This year, for the first time, we were able to secure Jamie MacDougall to act as host for the Festival. Jamie came to Haddo in late August to record introductions and the Festival trailer.

One element of the Festival was able to go ahead at Haddo. The visual arts exhibition, Experimental Use of 2m Space, was staged with one way system and social distancing in the South Courtyard and garden and despite the atrocious weather, attracted over 500 visitors.

An unexpected benefit of the coronavirus situation and moving the Festival online was that Haddo Children's Theatre (HCT) were able to take part, providing a recording of their 2019 production of "Dazzle" and ensuring that the Haddo family of arts organisations was represented in the Festival programme.

The Festival opened with a jazz piano programme titled "It's All Music Folks!" by Richard Michael. The performance was recorded at Haddo in the summer.

A chamber music recital by Gina McCormack and Nigel Clayton was recorded remotely for us in Mellerstain House. The recital was followed by the traditional Harvest Festival service from Haddo House Chapel.

The Festival saw the much anticipated return of Myrtle Throgmorton with her "Haddo House Tour", which featured a number of special guests who met Myrtle during her tour of Haddo House, which was filmed in the summer.

We presented a two part, remotely recorded event, featuring the North East Scotland Music School, with a short recital of music by Baermann and Schumann, and a lecture titled "Heritage of Storms: Lord Byron, His Romantic Inheritance and His Artistic Legacy" by Liz Merry.

Haddo Children's Theatre broadcast their production of "Dazzle" and the final event of the Festival saw the latest instalment of our Song for Haddo project, titled "Fables and Foibles". This was a joint Haddo Arts and McOpera response to the challenges and restrictions of the Covid pandemic and a refusal to deprive the children and young people of Aberdeenshire the opportunity to perform together.

Despite both singing and the playing of wind instruments being forbidden in schools or in groups due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the McOpera composers and musicians worked with children, young people, tutors and teachers from Aberdeenshire's schools and East Lothian children's choir Dunbar Voices to create a project celebrating music-making.

Following a specially devised series of pre-recorded videos, masterclass sessions and

musical tracks for the classroom and at home, a cast of 148 singers, wind and string players took part in an online musical re-imagining of 7 of Aesop's fables, taken from the series of Russell's paintings in Haddo House.

The YouTube recordings of most events remained available for public consumption for a period after the festival, resulting in a significant number of viewings for all events. Taking the festival online produced the added benefit of opening the Festival to an audience who would not normally be able to attend events at Haddo. This presents opportunities for the future in terms of hybrid events.

The Haddo Arts Festival was again selected to be part of EFFE (Europe for Festivals. Festivals for Europe) festival community for 2020-2021, facilitated by the European Festivals Association, and hopes to work more closely with arts organisations across Europe in future.

LOOKING FORWARD

Given the unusual circumstances of 2020, the Festival was considered to be a great success and a firm platform for going into our 10th anniversary Festival in 2021. Work continued during the early months of 2021 to develop proposals for the programme of events and activities for the 2021 and the 10th Haddo Arts Festival.

Funding applications for 2021-22 have met with significant success, allowing us to secure major international artists for the 2021 festival. This gives us confidence that we can deliver another successful festival despite the difficult situation in which the arts industry finds itself.

In preparation for the anniversary year, we have implemented a rebranding of Haddo Arts to present a fresh new image to our audience through our website, social media and printed output.

We look forward to 2021 with confidence and are already planning for 2022.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The number of Charity Trustees shall not be less that 3, nor more than 7 and in the event of their number falling below 3, such additional Charity Trustees shall be appointed as required.

Trustee remuneration and expenses

The Trustees may appoint one or more Charity Trustee (or any firm where the Trustee is a partner) to be professional advisors to the Charity or agent for the Charity Trustees in any other capacity and to pay any such advisor his or her their usual charges.

Charity Trustees may be reimbursed any expense reasonably incurred in the administration of the Charity.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an income and expenditure basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
